Stipends

An increase of up to 2% is assumed from 1st April 2020.

Set by National Church at 39.9% of National Minimum Stipend of the previous year.



The projected cost for council tax on clergy housing.

Quinquennials

By law all parsonages must be inspected every five years and works are carried out accordingly.

Ingoing works

This reflects the expected average cost of work carried out in relation to a new appointment.

Planned and reactive maintenance

Small repairs and reactive maintenance to parsonages e.g. for plumbing and heating.

Other property costs

This includes the cost for the operational property team and insurance costs.

Training:

Ordinand training

Our contribution to the National Church for training ordinands.

The desire of the c hurch nationally to increase the numb er of ordinands by 50% - an aim the diocese supports - is resulting in a signific ant increase in clergy training and ordinand support costs. This is the biggest contribut or to the overall 3.9% increase in training and support costs.

Central diocesan support:

Provision for diocesan wide support functions and advice for parishes including: safeguarding, public relations & communications, human resources, financial advice and guidance on governance matters, capped at 2.1% increase.

Capital Youth Strategy:

Double the number of 11 – 18 year olds engaging with existing or fresh expressions of church.
